HIGHLIGHTS

1.1 Recruitment

(a) Through Competitive Examinations with or without interview-

During the year 2021-22, the Commission conducted a total of 36 examinations under the method of recruitment by competitive examinations, i.e. one examination for Rajasthan State and Subordinate Services Combined Competitive Examination (Mains), 2021, Sub-Inspector/Platoon Commander Combined Competitive Examination, 2021 and 31 examinations for selection of Assistant Professors, College Education Department. A total of 809614 applications were received and processed during the year. A number of 4563 candidates were interviewed and 3761 candidates were selected.

At the commencement of the year under report, total 1225 vacancies were pending for notification. During the year, 16501 posts were received for notification and 1289 posts were notified i.e. 988 posts for Rajasthan State and Subordinate Services Combined Competitive Examination, 2021 and 261 posts for Department of Planning.

Under the method of recruitment by examination, the Commission recommended total 2427 candidates which included 497 SC, 408 ST, 1384 OBC & 138 EWS candidates while total reserved posts were 1444 (for SC-438, ST-339, OBC-577, EWS-90) only.

(b) Direct Recruitment through Interview-

During the year 2021-22, the Commission conducted a total of 13 screening tests to shortlist the candidates under the method of direct recruitment through interview alone which includes 10 screening tests for Lecturers, Ayurved and Indian Medical Department and one screening test for selection of Statistical Officer, Planning (Economics and Statistics) Department etc. A number of 900 candidates were interviewed and 334 candidates were selected. A number of 42 candidates recommended from reserve lists.

At the commencement of the year, total 414 vacancies were pending for notification & requisition for 1557 new vacancies received. Total 501 vacancies were notified that includes 337 posts for Assistant Professors, Medical Education Department, 2021 etc.

Under the method of direct recruitment through interview the Commission recommended total 224 reserved category candidates which included 61 SC, 39 ST, 90 OBC & 34 EWS candidates while total reserved posts were 172 (for SC-57, ST-41, OBC-50, EWS-24) only. (Chapter 11)

1.2 Recruitment Rules

During the reporting year, the Commission tendered advice/concurrence relating to amendments/formulation of various Service Rules covering around 134 Services. (Chapter16)

1.3 Disciplinary Cases

During the year 2021-22, 99 cases were received and 113 cases of previous year were pending for concurrence, making it a total of 212 cases. Out of which, advice tendered on 95 cases by Commission. (Chapter 15)

1.4 Departmental Promotion Committee

Total 407 DPC (Departmental Promotion Committee) meetings were held during the year and 7092 officers were recommended for promotion/selection. (Chapter 12)

1.5 Miscellaneous

A total of 7268 RTI Applications/Appeals under RTI Act were received during the year 2021-22. The Commission disposed off 6384 applications whereas, 81 applications were rejected and 983 applications were remained pending at the end of the year. These RTI applications and appeals were disposed off within the time limit prescribed under the RTIAct, 2005.

1.6 Significant Activities

- (a) The Foundation stone of proposed New Building for confidential work in the RPSC campus was laid down on 29-11-2021.
- (b) 73rd Establishment day of the RPSC was celebrated in the Commission's campus on 22-12-2021.
- (c) Meeting of the Standing Committee of the National Conference of Chairpersons of State PSCs was convened in the Commission's office on 7th January 2022.
- (d) The Updated version of RPSC Manual Volume-I & II were released by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Rajasthan at Chief Minister's Residence, Jaipur on 29-11-2021 and Hindi version of Manual Volume-I was also prepared and published for office use.
- (e) Pre litigation Committee has been constituted by the Commission to minimize the litigations. Now, candidates who are not satisfied by the procedures or decisions may submit their grievance before the Committee. A separate section for this has been established in the Commission's office.
- (f) An informative magazine "Spandan" regarding functioning of the Commission, history, role of the Public Service Commission, innovations adopted

by the Commission and the future perspective which the Commission envisages was released on 28-01-2022 by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Rajasthan at Chief Minister's Residence, Jaipur.

1.7 I.T. Innovations

The Commission is constantly endeavoring to make its affair candidate friendly. During the year, some new innovations have been initiated, most of them are -

(a) Grievance Redressal Portal -

A Grievance Redressal Portal was launched by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Rajasthan on 29-11-2021. This Portal facilitates the candidates to register their grievance from any of the place of the state or the country without their physical presence. All the candidates can get the benefit of the Portal. The grievances are resolved in time bound basis and actions taken in the grievances are uploaded on the Portal.

(b) One Time Registration (OTR) -

On 10th January 2022, in the larger interest of candidates, the Commission launched the facility of **One Time Registration** of profile. Now a candidate has to register once only on the recruitment portal to get a unique one time registration number. The candidate has to submit basic details once using JanAadhar/Aadhar/SSO ID. The details will be saved forever on the portal which will enable pre filling of the details in future application. OTR will not only make easier the process of form filling but it also minimize the duplicate and fake applications. It is a step towards One time document verification (ODV) also.

BRIEF HISTORY AND WORKLOAD OVER THE YEARS

- 2.1 The State of Rajasthan was formed as a result of the merger of the erstwhile, princely states situated in Rajputana and Part- 'C' State of Ajmer-Merwara. At the time of formation of Rajasthan, the institution of Public Service Commission existed in only three of the twenty-two covenanting States, viz. Jaipur, Jodhpur and Bikaner.
- 2.2 The successor administration after the merger of the Princely States on 16th August, 1949 promulgated an ordinance to establish the Rajasthan Public Service Commission, which was published on 20th August, 1949 in the gazette but it came into effect on 22nd December, 1949 when notification regarding appointment of Hon'ble Chairman and Members of the Commission was issued.
- 2.3 The provisions regarding Public Service Commission for the Union and for the State and appointment & term of office of Members have been laid down in Article 315 to 323 respectively in the Constitution of India.

- 2.4 At the time of establishment of the Commission, one chairman and two members were appointed. In the year 1962, the number of members increased to 3 whereas, the fourth member was appointed in the year 1965. In the year 1985, a new post of member was created hence; the composition of the Commission became One Chairman plus Five Members.
- 2.5 Now, the number of Members of the Commission had increased to **Seven** from Five vide notification dated 27-06-2011.
- 2.6 Earlier, the office of the Commission was located in Jaipur and after 31st August 1958 on the basis of recommendations of Rao Committee, the state government transferred the office of the Commission to Ajmer. On 21st October 2000, the Commission's office was shifted to its own new building at Ghooghra Ghati, Jaipur road, Ajmer.






THE COMMISSION'S OFFICE




RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE

REFORMS IN THE RECRUITMENT PROCESS

A - Mitigating Litigations

8.1 Every year numerous advertisements are issued by the Commission and a large number of candidates apply for various examinations. In the course of the recruitment process at different levels, dissatisfied candidates on several grounds approaches the Hon'ble courts to get certain relief. This causes burden of litigations. With an aim to provide candidates a mechanism within Commission for redressal of genuine issues advanced by them and in order to mitigate litigations, the Commission have decided to constitute a **Pre Litigation Committee** on 01.03.2019.

The composition of the committee is as follows;-

- 1. Chairman Hon'ble member (as nominated by the Hon'ble Chairman)
- 2. Members
 - i. Legal Advisor
 - ii. Secretary
 - iii. Member Secretary Joint Secretary
- 8.2 A separate section has been established in the Commission's office to deal with the applications received from the candidates. During the year, 05 meetings of pre litigation committee were held and 75 complaints were disposed off.

B – Expediting the Recruitment Process

- 8.3 The Commission initiated **counseling process** in the year 2019-20 to expedite the recruitment process. Earlier Detailed Application Forms (DAF) along with copies of documents regarding academic qualifications, category, experience etc. were called by post from candidates declared provisionally successful or for interview. The detailed forms were submitted by candidates by post which used to take at least one month to reach the concerning section. This was followed by tedious and time consuming process of scrutiny of application forms. Thereafter, interviews were conducted and recommendations were sent to government.
- 8.4 To reduce the time lag between declaration of results & Interview/recommendation, the Commission initiated process of counseling in which candidates are invited personally with their documents in Commission's Office. Teams were constituted comprising officers and employees of the Commission and officers and employees of the Commission and officers and employees of the concerned department for which recruitment is being done. These teams simultaneously perform the checking, scrutiny and verification of documents with original documents in presence of candidate himself. So that all sorts of shortcomings with regard to qualification, category, experience etc. can be resolved on the spot.
- 8.5 During the year, Commission organized Counseling for Lecturer Sanskrit Education, 2020 (various 09 subjects) and Assistant Engineer Combined Exam, 2018 (PWD Department, PHED Department, Water Resource Department and Panchayati Raj) in which a total number of 2240 candidates submitted their documents for checking and verification.



SYLLABI REVIEW/REVISION

9.1. Review, Revision and Redetermination of Syllabi: -

As per mandate given under various service rules, the Commission regularly undertakes exercise of Review, revision & redetermination of syllabi of various competitive examinations as well as screening tests to be conducted. Eminent subjectexperts are invited to participate in the workshops/ seminars organized by the Commission for this purpose.

RECRUITMENT

10.1 The primary work of the Public Service Commission is to recruit/select suitable personnel for various services/posts of the State Government. So far as the matter of recruitment of competent and suitable candidates for various services is concerned, the Public Service Commissions are expected to maintain high level of efficiency, quality, objectivity and transparency. It's a challenge for the Commission to conclude the recruitment procedure in a specific time limit. There are so many stages in the recruitment process from requisition to recommendation. With the passage of time, the numbers of aspirants have also increased. To meet out the increasing work load of various examinations, technological advancement and better management tools are essential. Efforts have been made to reduce the time lag between initial point of recruitment i.e. requisition to recommendation. Recently, Online Application System through more advanced State integrated

Recruitment Portal based on Rajasthan Single Sign-On (Raj SSO) has been introduced by the Commission.

10.2 The recruitment process is completed as per the provisions as laid down in the concerning Service Rules i.t. either by Direct recruitment through Interview alone or Competitive Examination with or without Interview. In case, where large number of aspirants applies for the direct recruitment posts, the Commission conducts screening test to short list the candidates for interview. The marks secured in the screening test were not considered at the time of final selection. However, after decision taken in full commission on 24-04-2019, now the policy of awarding marks in interview having three components, has been adopted. These are:weightage of academic performance, weightage of marks obtained in screening test and marks obtained in viva-voce test.

10.3 The Commission conducts different competitive examinations for recruitment to various posts/services on receipt of requisitions from the Government, some of them are as follows: -

10.4 Details of Requisitions and Posts advertised:






10.9 Requisitions and number of posts advertised to be filled through direct recruitment (by interview): - At the beginning of the year, 63 requisitions involving 414 posts were pending for notification. 38 requisitions involving 1557 posts were received during the year. Thus, making a total of 101 requisitions involving 1971 posts were to be notified during the year. Out of which, 77 requisitions involving 501 posts were notified during the year. During the year, 02 Requisitions involving 51 posts were returned to the government and 11 requisitions involving 17 posts were withdrawn by the Government after notification. Hence, 11 requisitions involving 1402 posts were pending for notification at the end of the year.



- 10.11 During the year, Commission received requisitions to recruit candidates against 16642 (92.23%) vacancies to various Non-technical posts which required general graduation degree as minimum gualification. Only 1317 (7.29%) vacancies belonged to specified professional qualifications in medical disciplines and 73 vacancies (0.41%) required specified qualification in engineering disciplines. Total 11 (0.061%) posts belonged to other technical qualifications. Thus, it is clear that in the year 2021-22, the requisitions received for the post of Non-Technical posts were more than of Medical, Engineering & Technical posts. Statement showing the number of Medical, Technical and Non-Technical posts for which requisitions were received during the year 2021-2022 is given in Appendix VII-A.
- 10.12 In last financial year 2021-2022, a total number of 1790 posts were advertised out of that, 1388 (77.5%) posts were Non-Technical posts. 337 (18.83%) posts were of Medical Education

Department, 53 (2.96%) posts of Engineering Department and 12 (0.67%) belongs to other remaining Technical Departments. The above analysis makes it clear that in the last financial year 2021-22, the posts which required specialized Non-Technical qualification were advertised more than that of Technical posts. Department wise/category wise break-up of requisitions advertised against requisitions received during the year 2021-2022 is shown in Appendix VII-B.

- 10.13 A list of posts for which requisitions were cancelled after issuance of advertisement but before Interview has been given at Appendix VII-F.
- 10.14 During the period under report, the Commission recommended names of 42 candidates from reserve lists. Details are given in Appendix VII-H.
- 10.15 **Screening Tests:** The Commission conducted 13 screening tests for short listing the candidates in respect of 61 posts of various departments. The details of screening tests conducted are given in Appendix VII-E.



- 10.16 Details of posts advertised but selections not concluded during the year under report has been given in Appendix VII D.
- 10.17 The posts for which Interviews were held but Candidates were not found Suitable during the year under report has been listed in Appendix VII–G.

- 10.18 Details of posts for which advertisement issued, but no candidate applied are given in Appendix VII-I.
- 10.19 Details of posts for which Interviews were fixed but none of the candidates present has been given in Appendix VII-J.
- 10.20 Interview Boards: During the year under report, the Commission interviewed 5017 candidates through 127 Boards constituted for various posts/services; out of that 4108 candidates were those who were shortlisted for interview after competitive examinations and remaining 909 candidates were directly called for interview in accordance with the service rules for the post for which they applied. The number of days on which one, two, three and four Boards interviewed the candidates was 46, 6, 28 and 47 respectively.
- 10.21 Candidates debarred from the Commission's examinations- During the year, total eight (08) candidates were debarred for certain period/forever for use of unfair means/ impersonation in examinations conducted by the Commission.
- 10.22 **Key Validation:-** In order to conduct the recruitment process in a transparent and efficient manner, Commission has adopted policy of issuing of model answer key, inviting objections from the candidates and assessing those through expert committees. During the year 2021-22, Commission organised 120 workshops of subject experts to examine and assess the objections made by candidates with regard to 124 model answer keys issued. On the basis of the report submitted by the subject experts, total 75 final Answer keys were finalized for result declaration and these keys were published on R.P.S.C website.



RESERVATION FOR SC, ST, OBC, M.B.C., E.W.S, Specially Abled AND WOMAN CANDIDATES (WD & DV)

(a) Recruitment by examination with or without interview

11.1 Reservation of Vacancies for various categories is provided in accordance with orders of the Government for such reservation in force at the time of recruitment. Reservation of 16, 12, 21, 5 and 10 *percent* of posts have been prescribed for candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Class (for OBC's w.e.f. 28/09/93), Most Backward Class (for MBC's w.e.f. 13/02/2019) and Economically Weaker Section (for EWS w.e.f. 19/02/2019). 30% reservation of vacancies has been fixed for woman candidates (out of that 8% and 2% are reserved for widow & divorcee candidates) in direct recruitment. Reservation of vacancies for woman candidates is

category wise i.e. to be adjusted proportionately in the respective category are reserved to which they belong and the reservation shall be treated as horizontal (for woman candidates vide Notification dated 7/06/99 w.e.f. 01/04/99). Similarly, *4 percent* reservation of vacancies has been fixed for Physically Disabled candidates in direct recruitment, which shall be treated as horizontal and adjusted from among all categories (reservation for Specially Abled candidates enforced vide Notification dated 24-01-2019).

Other categories i.e. ex-serviceman, sports person, non-gazetted employees, departmental candidates, ministerial employees etc. are also provided reservation as per government orders & circular issued time to time.




DEPARTMENTAL PROMOTION COMMITTEES AND OTHER COMMITTEES

- 12.1 Various Services Rules prescribe method of recruitment by promotion for certain posts. The Commission holds DPC meetings for the posts falling in purview of Commission. During the year, the Commission held 407 meetings of Departmental Promotion Committees for promotion of total 7092 officers/employees.
- 12.2 The meetings of Regular Committee were held on 277 occasions for promoting 5608 persons of which highest number of incumbents belonged to the Agriculture Department (25). Other important departments were Finance Department (16), Sanskrit Education Department (22), Medical Education Gr.-I Department (15), Home Department (21), State Forensic Science

Laboratory (18) and Mines and Geology Department (16).

- 12.3 The meetings of Review Committee were also held on 85 occasions for promoting 383 persons, of which highest number of incumbents belonged to the Home Department (16) and other important departments were Department of Personnel (06), Agriculture Department (05), Finance Department (08), Primary & Secondary Education Department (08), and Medical and Health/Ayurved Department (06).
- 12.4 Meetings of Screening Committee were also held on 45 occasions for regularizing 1101 persons belonged to various departments.





EXTENSION IN THE TERM OF TEMPORARY APPOINTMENTS

- 13.1 As per the regulation 7 of the RPSC (Limitation of Functions) Regulations, 1951 consultation of the Commission is necessary for making temporary or adhoc appointments. The matters of temporary or adhoc appointments referred to Commission for concurrence have been mentioned year to year basis. The Government has also been apprised of the alarming position in regard to the cases of adhoc/temporary appointments lasting over 10 years with the intention that the Government might take expeditious steps for regularizing those cases. The position of adhoc/temporary appointments still remained unchanged. An illustrative list of long outstanding cases of such adhoc/temporary appointments has been mentioned in Appendix IX.
- 13.2 During the period under report, the Commission accorded their concurrence for extension in the term of temporary appointments in respect of 975 persons appointed against the posts to be filled by direct recruitment quota. The details as per has been given in Appendix-XI.
- 13.3 During the period under report, the Commission

accorded their concurrence for extension in the term of temporary appointments in respect of 04 persons appointed against the posts to be filled by Promotion Quota, the details thereof have been given in Appendix-X.

- 13.4 The number of such *adhoc/*temporary appointees was 979 during the year, while it was 2659 in the previous year. It is expected that the Government will take appropriate action in order to put a check on such appointments.
- 13.5 Some of the appointing authorities have failed to furnish complete information in the prescribed performa while referring the cases of urgent/ temporary appointments to the Commission for obtaining their concurrence. The result is that the Commission had to refer it back to concerned authority before considering the case for conveying their concurrence. A list of cases which remained pending during the year for consideration for want of information is enclosed in Appendix-XII.

15.4 Litigations/Writs:- Total 4975 legal cases including 808 new cases & 4167 previous year's balance, were alive during the year against the Commission or by the Commission. These included writ petitions, special appeals and contempt petitions before the High court, special leave petitions & appeals before Hon'ble Supreme court and other civil service or consumer matters before tribunals & civil court at district/state level. During the period under review, the number of cases decided by the various courts was 571. Thus, at the end of the year, total 4404 cases are awaiting decision in various courts.




SERVICE RULES

Article 320 (3) of the Constitution prescribes mandatory consultation with the Commission on the matters & methods of recruitment and principles to be followed in making recruitments & appointments to civil services & for civil posts. During the year, the Commission has considered 134 cases referred to, with regard to amendments in Service Rules or formulation of new rules. The details are as follows-

- 16.1 The Commission conveyed their concurrence to Draft Amendments with regard **104 Rules/ Schedules** relating to various services which were referred to the Commission during the year. Further, **02 Service Rules** related with Rajasthan Rural Ayurvedic, Unani, Homeopathy and Naturopathy Service Rules, 2008 and Rajasthan Rural Ayurvedic, Unani, Homeopathy and Naturopathy Subordinate Service Rules, 2008 were repealed. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XIII.
- 16.2 During the year, the Commission also examined and dealt with the draft of **02 New Service Rules**. Details thereof have been given in Appendix- XIV.
- 16.3 During the year, the Government has promulgated 04 New Service Rules and amended 21 Service Rules/Regulations as shown in Appendix-XV.
- 16.4 During the year, the Commission has also examined and dealt with **01 case** under the Rajasthan Compassionate Appointment of

Dependents of Deceased Government Service Rules, 1996. A detail thereof has been given in Appendix-XVI.

- 16.5 During the year under report, the Commission has also examined and dealt with **07 cases** for appointment to various posts under Compassionate appointment of Dependants of Deceased/ Permanently incapacitated Armed Forces Service Personnel/Para Military Personnel. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XVII. During the year under report, the Commission returned certain cases without concurrence. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XVII-A.
- 16.6 The Commission has not received during the year any case of recognition of Degree/Diploma/ Certificate/Examination etc. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XVII-B.
- 16.7 During the year under the report, the Commission have opined on the Draft of the Rajasthan Governor's Secretariat Rules, 2021 regarding inclusion of the role of the Commission in the said Draft Rules of 2021.
- 16.8 During the year under report, the Government has proposed amendment regarding removal of interview in recruitment process and determining weightage of Interview for certain posts related to 48 Service Rules, wherein, the Commission have conveyed their concurrence with regard to 13 Service Rules only.

18.8 Implementation of the "Right to Information Act, 2005":

A REVIEW OF PERFORMANCE OF THE CANDIDATES IN THE RAJASTHAN STATE & SUBORDINATE SERVICES COMBINED COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION, 2018

- 19.1 This examination was conducted to make recruitment for 1051 (Non-TSP & TSP) posts of State, Allied and Subordinate Services. The posts were advertised on 02.04.2018 for which last date of receipt of applications for non-tsp was fixed as 31.05.2018 and for TSP candidates, the posts were advertised on 04.05.2018 and last date of receipt of application was fixed as 16.06-2018.
- 19.2 Preliminary examination was conducted on 05.08.2018 at 1454 centers (situated at all 33 District Headquarters). Result of Preliminary Examination was declared on 23.10.2018, 13.12.2018, 20.12.2018 & 31.05.2019. The RAS Mains Written Examination was conducted on June, 25 and June 26, 2019. Result of Mains (Written) Examination was declared on 09.07.2020 & 12.03.2021 and interviews of

qualified candidates were held from 22-03-2021 to 26-03-2021, 31-03-2021 to 16-04-2021 and 21-06-2021 to 13-07-2021.

- 19.3 After interviewing the candidates, final result was declared on 13.07.2021. Recommendations of 1926 selected candidates were sent to the Government on 19.07.2021, 28.07.2021, 19.08.2021, 12.10.2021.
- 19.4 The study reveals status of 1926 recommended candidates which is based on the information furnished by them in their application forms with regard to the academic attainments, experience etc. and their performance in the examination. A number of 1969 candidates were interviewed, out of them 43 candidates were rejected after interview and finally 1926 candidates were recommended to the Government.

Other States

- 19.5 Out of 1926 recommended candidates (including 37 candidates from outside the State), the districts that provided more than 50 per cent candidates were Jaipur, Jodhpur, Alwar, Sikar, Jhunjhunu, Bharatpur. The Jaipur district provided the highest i.e. 20.09 percent.
- 19.6 The above table further reveals that out of 215 (150 Males+65 Females) amongst SC candidates whose name were recommended as many as 21.39 percent belonged to Jaipur district and out

of 185 (136 Males+49 Females) amongst ST candidates who were recommended, as many as 22.70 percent belonged to Jaipur district.

- 19.7 The districts like Chittorgarh, Rajsamand, Sirohi and Udaipur which have significant ST's population were either totally unrepresented or provided marginal candidates. However, from other ST dominant districts such as Dungarpur and Banswara, there are total 7 representations of ST's, 4 from Banswara and 3 from Dungarpur.
- 19.8 **Position of women candidates in the selection**:- Out of the total recommendations, the number of women candidates recommended were 581 (including 272 General, 65 SC, 49 ST, 183 OBC, 12 MBC). The following table shows category wise position of selection of woman candidates against the posts reserved for them:-

19.9 **University wise classification**: - The table below reveals that out of 1926 candidates recommended, 1604 (83.28%) were graduates of various Universities of the Rajasthan. The University of Rajasthan has highest number of representation i.e. 33.85% graduates. Among the recommended candidates, 322 (16.71%) candidates obtained their Graduation degree from various Universities of other States.

19.10 Educational status:- From among 1926 recommended candidates, 1425, 452 and 49 were having first, second and third division respectively at their graduation level. The candidates having good academic record at schooling maintained their standard. Further, analysis of educational status of these candidates reveals that as many as 901(46.78%) candidates own post-graduation degree. A Comparative performance of the candidates having Graduation Degree and those having additional P.G. Degree is shown in the following table: -

19.11 **Change of Faculty**: - Change of faculty i.e. switching over from one faculty to another, after Graduation (i.e. at Post-Graduation level) has also been observed in some of the candidates. The details are as follows: -

Whatever might have been the reason of such switch over from one faculty to another, but this has certainly put them in an advantageous position in having a larger spectrum of subjects to choose their optional subjects.

- 19.12 **Rural/Urban background:** It is difficult to classify rural/urban background of the candidates and to have a clear cut classification. Thus, the place of schooling has been set as the criteria of such classification. Keeping this fact in view, it has been observed that out of 1926 recommended candidates, 1211 (62.87%) were from urban and 715 (37.12%) candidates from rural background. A long standing, reputed educational institutions equipped with better infrastructure at the Divisional Headquarters have contributed largely towards the better performance in this examination.
- 19.13 Employment status:- Out of 1926 recommended candidates, as many as 1030 (53.47%) were already in service, in one capacity or the other in Government or private organizations and 896 (46.52%) were unemployed fresh candidates. It reveals that experience has played an important role in the selections.
- 19.14 **Contribution of age factor**: Age factor also continues to play a positive role in the performance of the candidates. Nearly (1627) 84.47% candidates were in the age group of 21 to 33 years.

APPENDIX-I

Functions of the Commission

The functions exercised by the Rajasthan Public Service Commission are laid down in Article 320 of the Constitution of India.

The Public Service Commission shall be consulted:-

- (a) On all matters relating to methods of recruitment to civil services and for civil posts;
- (b) On the principles to be followed in making appointments to civil service and posts and in making promotions and transfers from one service to another and on the suitability of candidates for such appointments, promotions or transfers;
- (c) On all disciplinary matters affecting a person serving under State Government in civil capacity, including memorials or petitions relating to such matters;
- (d) On any claim by or in respect of a person who is serving or has served under the State Government, in a civil capacity that any costs incurred by him in defending legal proceeding instituted against him in respect of acts done or purporting to be done in the execution of his duty should be paid out of the Consolidated Fund of the State;
- (e) On any claim for the award of a pension in respect of injuries sustained by a person while serving under the State Government in a civil capacity and any question as to the amount of any such award; and
- (f) Any other matter referred to them by the Government.

It shall not be necessary for the Commission to be consulted in matters relating to methods of recruitment to Civil Services and Posts, or the principles to be followed in making appointments to such posts, or the suitability of the candidates for such appointments :-

Unless otherwise provided in the relevant Service Rules for recruitment to any post in a Service, when the appointment is to be made to any post -

- 1. in Ministerial Service, or
- 2. in Subordinate Service or State Service whether technical or non-technical starting with an initial Grade Pay of "Rs. 3600/- or less per month" as per R.P.S.C. (Limitation of Functions) Regulations, 1951.

Dr. Singh has studied various geotourism sites, geomorphites, geosites, and geoparks on an international level and concurrent with the modified Knapic et al., 2009, USA scale. He found that water bodies of Rajasthan are the most suitable as hydrogeotourism sites.

"Hydrogeotourism refers to tourism that sustains or enhances the geological and

geographical character of the water impounding place or structures being visited, including its scientific educational value, environment, culture, aesthetics, heritage and well-being of its residents. Hydrogeotourists are conscious of the environment and inclined to seek culture and unique experiences when they travel to water impounding places or structures of any area."

This is a new segment in tourism. As such, it has a vast and untapped potential to be promoted as an extended subcategory of educational or ecotourism or destination events or royal wedding and social gathering tourism. This endeavour can directly help in:-

- The growth of tourism
- Restoration of the world famous royal heritage of Rajasthan
- Most importantly, it can help save water from contamination. The pollution level in most of these water bodies is extremely high and steadily rising. The hydrogeotourism approach will make the society more conscious towards these water bodies. Hence, it will be directly responsible for the potential increase of safe drinking water for our societies.
