# I. THE COMMISSION

The State of Rajasthan was formed as a result of the merger of the erstwhile, princely States situated in Rajputana and Part-'C' State of Ajmer-Merwara. At the time of formation of Rajasthan the institution of Public Service Commission existed in only three of the twenty-two covenanting States, viz. Jaipur, Jodhpur and Bikaner.

The successor administration after the merger of the princely States promulgated on 16<sup>th</sup> August, 1949 an ordinance establishing, the Rajasthan Public Service Commission, which was published on 20<sup>th</sup> August, 1949 but it came into existence from 22<sup>nd</sup> December, 1949 after issuing notification regarding appointment of Hon'ble Chairman and Members of the Commission.

The provisions regarding Public Service Commission for the Union and for the State and appointment & term of office of Members have been laid down in Article 315 & 316 respectively in the Constitution of India.

- 1.1 The functions of the Commission as laid down in Article 320 of the Constitution of India are given in Appendix-I.



- 1.3 Dr. Lalit K. Panwar retired from the post of Chairman on July 10, 2017. Sh. S.S. Sharma, Member took over the charge of the Chairman of the Commission on July 11,2017 (A/N) and retired from the post of Chairman on September 28, 2017 (A/N). Dr. Radhey Shyam Garg took over the charge of the Chairman of the Commission on December 18,2017 (A/N).
- 1.4 Two posts of member remained vacant till end of the year under reported upon.
- 1.5 A brief write-up on the profiles of Hon'ble Chairman and Hon'ble Members is given in Appendix-II.
- 1.6 A list containing names along with tenure of office of former Hon'ble Chairman and Hon'ble Members is available at Appendix III-(A) & (B).
- 1.7 In sub-regulation (1)of regulation-3 of the Rajasthan Public Service Commission (Conditions of Service) Regulations, 1974 for the existing expression "Five", the expression "Seven" was substituted vide Notification No. F.8(4)DOP/A-II/2011 dated 27-06-2011 issued by Department of Personnel (A-2). It means the number of Members of the Commission had increased to seven instead of five.

#### 3.2 Guest House:



# **VI. RECRUITMENT**

- The primary work of the Public Service Commission is to recruit personnel for various service/posts of the State Government. So far as the matter of recruitment of competent candidates for various services is concerned the Public Service Commissions are required to maintain high efficiency, quality, objectivity and transparency. It's a challenge for the Commission to complete the recruitment procedure in a specific time limit. There are so many stages in the recruitment process from requisition to recommendation. Number of aspirants are being increased. To meet the increasing number of candidates in various examinations, latest techniques and better management is required. Efforts have been made to reduce the time lag between requisitions to recommendation. Online Application System has been introduced by the Commission.
- 6.2 The recruitment process is completed either by Direct recruitment through Interview alone or Competitive Examination with or without Interview as per the provisions as laid down in the concerning Service Rules. In case, where large number of aspirants apply for the direct recruitment posts, the Commission conducts screening tests to short list the candidates.
- 6.3 Interview Boards:- During the year under report, the Commission interviewed 5532+1654=7186 (Examination + Recruitment) candidates for different posts/ services by constituting 88 Boards. The number of days on which one, two Board interviewed the candidates were 223.


6.5 During the year under report, 15 requisitions involving 517 posts were pending notification at the commencement of the year. 27 requisitions involving 4071 posts were received during the year. Thus making a total of 42 requisitions involving 4588 posts were pending to be notified. Out of which 29 requisitions involving 2287 posts were advertised during the year. No requisitions were withdrawn by the govt. and 2 requisitions involving 3 posts were returned to the govt. during the year. Hence, at the end of the year 11 requisitions involving 2298 posts were pending for notification with the Commission.



- 6.11 During the year under report 29 requisitions involving 227 posts were pending notification at the commencement of the year. 27 requisitions involving 253 posts were received during the year. Thus making a total of 56 requisitions involving 480 posts were pending to be notified received from the Government. Out of which 3 requisitions involving 33 posts were notified during the year. 26 requisitions involving 199 posts were returned to the Government. Hence 25 requisitions involving 246 posts were pending notification at the end of the year.

- 7.1. **Review, Revision and Redrafting of syllabi:-** Review, revision and redrafting of syllabi of various subjects prescribed for various competitive examinations and screening tests conducted by the Commission, have become a regular process. Eminent subject-experts were invited to participate in the workshops/seminars organized by the Commission, for this purpose.

# VIII. RESERVATION FOR SC, ST, OBC, S.B.C., P.D. AND WOMAN CANDIDATES

#### (a) Recruitment by examination with or without interview:

8.1. Reservation of 16, 12, 21 and 1 per cent of posts has been fixed for candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Class and Special Backward Class respectively (for OBC's w.e.f. 28/09/93) (For SBC's w.e.f. 25/08/2009). 30% reservation of vacancies has been fixed for woman candidates in direct recruitment. Reservation of vacancies for woman candidates is to be adjusted proportionately in the respective category to which they belong and the reservation shall be treated as horizontal (for woman candidates vide Notification dated 7/06/99 w.e.f. 01/04/99). Similarly, 3 per cent reservation of vacancies has been fixed for Physically Disabled candidates in direct recruitment, which shall be treated as horizontal and adjusted from among all categories (reservation for Physically Disabled candidates enforced vide Notification dated 22-09-2000.

#### (b) Recruitment through interview alone:

8.2 In case of recruitment through interview alone, the Commission selected and recommended candidates as per details given below:-



# IX. DEPARTMENTAL PROMOTION COMMITTEES AND OTHER COMMITTEES

- 9.1. The Commission held meetings of Departmental Promotion Committees on 312 occasions to regularize ad hoc/temporary appointments of posts involving 19830 persons, of which highest number of cases pertained to the Primary & Secondary Education Department (113) and other important Department were Agriculture Department (40) Medical & Health/Ayurved Department (19) Department of Personnel (15) and Finance Department (15).
- 9.2. The meetings of Review Committees were also held on 114 occasions for regularizing 3060 persons, of which highest number of cases pertained to the Primary and Secondary Education Department (51), Finance Department (15) Medical & Health/Ayurved Department (8) Irrigation (Water Resources) Department (7) Co-Operative Department (6) and Law & Legal Affairs Department (06).
- 9.3. Meetings of Screening Committees were also held on 47 occasions for regularizing 1112 persons.



# X. EXTENSION IN THE TERM OF TEMPORARY APPOINTMENTS


- 10.1. A mention was made in the previous year's report in regard to the cases of ad hoc/temporary appointments referred to the Commission for obtaining their concurrence to the extension of their terms to temporary appointments. The Government has also been apprised of the alarming position in regard to the cases of ad hoc/temporary appointment lasting over 10 years with the intention that the Government might take expeditious steps for regularizing those cases. The position of ad hoc/temporary appointments still remained unchanged. An illustrative list of long outstanding case of such ad hoc/temporary appointments has again been mentioned in Appendix IX.
- 10.2 During the period under report, The Commission accorded their concurrence for extension in the terms of Temporary appointments in respect of 748 persons appointed against the posts to be filled by Direct recruitment quota as per the details given in Appendix-XI.
- 10.3 The number of such ad hoc/temporary appointees were 844 during the year, while it was 1243 in the previous year. The Government will take appropriate action in order to put a check on such appointments.
- 10.4 During the period under report, The Commission accorded their concurrence for extension in the terms of temporary appointments in respect of 96 persons appointed against the posts to be filled by Promotion quota as per the details given in Appendix-X.
- 10.5 Some of the appointing authorities failed to furnish complete information in the prescribed performa while referring the cases of urgent/temporary appointments to the Commission for obtaining their concurrence. The result is that the Commission had to make a back reference before considering the case for conveying their concurrence. During the year incomplete reference, involving 85 persons appointed against Direct recruitment quota / Promotion quota posts were referred to the Commission. A list there of is available in Appendix-XII.

# XI. IRREGULAR APPOINTMENTS

11.1 No case of irregular appointment made by the departments was observed by the Commission during the year under report.

### XII. DISCIPLINARY CASES AND APPEALS

- 12.1. <u>Disciplinary cases</u>:-101 cases were pending with the Commission on 01-4-17. During the year under report, the Commission received 80 new cases, making a total of 181 cases; the Commission tendered their advice on 82 cases i.e. on 101 cases received in previous year's and on 17 cases received in the current year.
- Out of 101 cases of the previous year's, advice tendered on 82 cases, 07 cases are under query with the Government and 12 cases are under Commissions Consideration.
- 12.3 Out of 80 cases of the current year, advice tendered on 17 cases and 63 cases were under consideration of the Commission.
- Hence, total number of cases on which advice tendered by the Commission is 17+82=99.
- 12.5 During the current year 90 cases except last year 7 cases pending with the Government thus making a total of 82 cases pending with the Commission and 63 cases were under consideration of the Commission.



- 12.6 <u>Appeal/Review D.E. Cases</u>:- During the year under report, neither a single case of Review D.E. nor any case of Appeal was received by the Commission.
- 12.7 <u>Litigations/Writs</u>: During the year under report, 2972 cases in addition to 1372 cases of previous years of Civil suits/Complaints/ Writ petitions/appeals/D.B. special appeals/S.L.P. filed in the Civil Courts/High Court/Service Tribunal/Supreme Court/State Consumer Protection Commission/ District Consumer Forum etc. were pending, thus, making a total of 4344 cases. During the period under review, the number of cases decided by the various courts was 947. Thus, in all, 3397 cases were awaiting decision in the various Courts.

# XIII. SERVICE RULES

- 13.1 Draft Amendments to 100 Rules / Schedules relating to various Services were referred to the Commission for their concurrence which were conveyed in all Draft Amendments. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XIII.
- 13.2 During the year under Report the Commission has also examined and dealt with the Draft of 05 New Rules. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XIV.
- 13.3 During the year under report the Government has promulgated New Service Rules and amendments in 32 Service Rules/Regulations as shown in Appendix-XV.
- During the year under Report the Commission dealt Not a single case of Recognition of Degree / Diploma / Certificate etc. was dealt by the Commission Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XVI.
- 13.5 During the year under Report Commission received 2 cases of Compassionate Appointment of Dependents of Deceased Government Servant to the post of Tehsil Revenue Accountant and Jr. Accountant for their concurrence. These cases were examined under the provisions of the Rajasthan Compassionate Appointment of dependants of Deceased Government Servants Rules, 1996 which is under correspondence and reply from concerned departments is still awaited. Details thereof have been given in Appendix-XVII.

# XVII. A review of performance of the candidates in the Rajasthan State & Subordinate Services Combined Competitive Examination, 2016.

This examination was conducted to make recruitment for 725 posts of State, Allied and Subordinate Services. The posts were advertised on 28.04.2016 for which last date of receipt of applications was fixed on 25.06.2016.

Preliminary examination was conducted on 28.08.2016 at 1224 centers (at all 33 District Headquarters). Result of Preliminary Examination was declared on 15.09.2016 & 01.12.2016.

Main Written Examination was fixed from 27.03.2017 to 28.03.2017. Result of Main (Written) Examination was declared on 25.06.2017 and interviews of qualified candidates were held from 02.08.2017 to 17.10.2017.

After interviewing the candidates, final result was declared 17.10.2017. Recommendations of 1659 selected candidates were sent to the Government on 17.01.2018, 15.02.2018 & 14.03.2018.

Out of 1659 recommended candidates (including 107 candidates outside the State), the districts that provided more than 50 *per cent* candidates were Jaipur, Jodhpur, Alwar, Sikar, Jhunjhunu, Nagaur, Karauli. The Jaipur district provided the highest i.e. 18.02 *per cent*.

The above table further reveals that out of 217 (163 Male+54 Female) SC candidates recommended as many as 24.42 per cent belonged to Jaipur district and out of 190 (140 Male + 50 Female), ST candidates recommended, as many as 21.05 *per cent* belonged to Jaipur district.

The districts like Chittorgarh, Pratapgarh, Rajsamand, Sirohi and Udaipur which are dominant in ST's population, were either totally unrepresented or provided one or two candidates. However from other ST dominant district such as Dungarpur and Banswara there is some representation of ST's.

Further analysis of the castewise disribution in the selection to key State Services reveals that amongst Sc's nearly 87.15% representation was from the Balai, Khatik, Meghwal, Regar. Chamar, Bairwa & Jatav. However, in case of ST majority of the candidates (90.52%) belonged to Meena community.

This observation is permanent feature and is a result of non-participation by rest of the castes amongst SCs

and STs. This is due to their socio-economic backwardness, which continued to be the greatest hindrance in their educational and other attainments. These observations have been pointed out in earlier reviews also. It is, therefore again recommended that some integrated approach be planned out to bridge up such disparities.

<u>Position of woman candidates in the selection</u>: - Total 449 women candidates (including 227 General, 54 SC, 50 ST, 111 OBC, 7 SBC) were also recommended. The following table shows category wise position of selection of woman candidates against the posts reserved for them:-

<u>University wise classification</u>:-The table below reveals that out of 1659 candidates recommended 1305 (78.66%) were graduates of various Universities of the Rajasthan the highest i.e. 32.36% graduates were from the University of Rajasthan alone. Among the recommended candidates 354 (21.34%) candidates obtained their Graduation degree from various Universities of other States.

<u>Educational status</u>: From among 1659 recommended candidates, 1251, 389 and 19 were having first, second and third division respectively at their graduation level. The candidates having good academic record at schooling, maintained their standard.

Further analysis of educational status of these candidates reveals that as many as 824 (49.67%) were post-graduates. Comparative performance of the candidates having Graduation Degree and those having additional P.G. Degree, is shown in the following table:-

Whatever might have been the reason of such switch over from one faculty to another, but this has certainly put them in an advantageous position in having a larger spectrum of subjects to choose their optional subjects.

Rural/Urban background: - It is difficult to classify rural/urban background of the candidates and to have a clear cut classification. Thus, the place of schooling has been the criteria of such classification. Keeping this fact in view, it has been observed that out of 1659 recommended candidate 1172 (70.64%) were those, who were having urban and 487 (29.36%) rural background.

The Divisional Headquarters, having educational institutions of long standing, repute and equipped with better infrastructure have contributed largely towards the better performance in this examination.

**Employment status**: Out of 1659 recommended candidates, as many as 940 (56.66%) were already in service, in one capacity or the other in Government or private organizations and 719 (43.34 %) were unemployed fresh candidates. It reveals that experience has played an important role in the selections.

<u>Contribution of age factor</u>: - Age factor also continues to play a positive role in the performance of the candidates. Nearly 84.21% candidates were in the age group of 21 to 33 years.

# **APPENDICES**

#### **APPENDIX I**

#### **Functions of the Commission**

The functions exercised by the Rajasthan Public Service Commission are laid down in Article 320 of the Constitution of India.

The Public Service Commission shall be consulted:-

- (a) On all matters relating to methods of recruitment to civil services and for civil posts;
- (b) On the principles to be followed in making appointments to civil service and posts and in making promotions and transfers from one service to another and on the suitability of candidates for such appointments, promotions or transfers;
- (c) On all disciplinary matters affecting a person serving under State Government in civil capacity, including memorials or petitions relating to such matters;
- (d) On any claim by or in respect of a person who is serving or has served under the State Government, in a civil capacity that any costs incurred by him in defending legal proceeding instituted against him in respect of acts done or purporting to be done in the execution of his duty should be paid out of the Consolidated Fund of the State;
- (e) On any claim for the award of a pension in respect of injuries sustained by a person while serving under the State Government in a civil capacity and any question as to the amount of any such award; and
- (f) Any other matter referred to them by the Government.

It shall not be necessary for the Commission to be consulted in matters relating to methods of recruitment to Civil Services and Posts, or the principles to be followed in making appointments to such posts, or the suitability of the candidates for such appointments:-

Unless otherwise provided in the relevant Service Rules for recruitment to any post in a Service, when the appointment is to be made to any post -

- 1 in Ministerial Service, or
- in Subordinate Service or State Service whether technical or non-technical starting with an initial Grade Pay of "Rs. 3600/- or less per month" as per R.P.S.C. (Limitation of Functions) Regulations, 1951.
