Application for early listing is allowed.

By way of this writ petition, the petitioner has prayed for giving her appointment on the post of Senior Teacher (English) under the Divorcee Quota (OBC Category).

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner submitted the application form for the post in question on 22.09.2013 and she appeared in the said examination on 21.02.2014 and 24.02.2014. Counsel further submits that the petitioner has applied to the respondent for considering her case under the Divorcee Quota (OBC Category) as during pendency of the selection process, decree of divorce has been granted by the learned Family Court vide judgment and decree dated 21.05.2014.

Counsel for the respondents has opposed the writ petition and submits that the petitioner was not having the decree of





divorce on the last date of submitting the application form, therefore, her case was rightly not considered under the Divorcee Quota (OBC Category) by the respondents.

Heard counsel for the parties and perused the record.



This writ petition filed on behalf of the petitioner deserves to be dismissed for the reason that admittedly the petitioner was not having the decree of divorce on the last date of submitting the application form, therefore, in my considered view, no illegality has been committed by the respondents in not considering the case of the petitioner under the Divorcee Quota (OBC Category).

In that view of the matter, no case is made out for interference of this Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.

Hence, this writ petition is dismissed.
